The Colorado River water will be cut off - California will have no water

Talking Points

- Cut off our water and we cut off cheap imports to the rest of the USA.
- Most of the water used here, is already here.
 Only a small portion comes from outside
 California.
- The development of small scale reservoirs and catchment systems is smart water management in both drought and heavy rainfall. Especially important with climate change, and would provide excellent infrastructure employment.
- Multi-national corporations like Nestle should be prohibited from bottling our water and selling elsewhere.
- It is to the benefit of America to maintain water flow to California in exchange for crop purchase.
- Promoting conservation and sustainability in agriculture, commercial and home use is important regardless of Colorado Facts.

FACTS

90% of America's fruit and vegetables are provided by California. Without the water, California can't make that food and America will be left with only eating corn, potatoes, and wheat every day.

More than 60% of the water for California comes from the mountains in California, managed by the Federal government. Researchers at UC Merced found that if the Federal government managed the forest better, they could produce up to 16% more water.

The Colorado river really is only an issue for the LA area, not all of California.

The largest desalination plan in the western hemisphere is in California, built in the last few years, at the cost of \$1B. It is just south of LA in Carlsbad. If California had \$30B extra tax money each year, it could literally build 30 more of these giant desalination plants – in one year. In just 2 years California could build 60 desalination plants off the coast of LA.

America will not help CA in a natural or financial disaster

Talking Points

- So what? With the tax money we will save, we will be very well able to help ourselves.
- Whenever there is a natural disaster anywhere in the world, America is the first to help.
- Part of starting an Independent California
 Nation is developing mutual assistance
 strategies with neighboring Countries. There is
 no reason that over time a plan that benefits
 both America and California won't be
 implemented. Look at the strong alliance
 between the UK and America, despite the
 initial break.
- "When flood waters engulfed the Midwest, when hurricanes swamped the East Coast, Californians were willing to help. Now, Californians need the nation's help." -Governor Wilson 1994
- "We got no help from the Federal government." – Governor Davis 2003
- North Carolina received just 1% of what it asked for in Hurricane Matthew relief funds 2017.

FACTS

We barely get anything now.

1989 Earthquake – It took more than 2 years after the event for the Federal government to actually pay for assistance. California raised taxes to rebuild.

1992 Recession - California needs help out of recession and is denied by the Federal government.

1994 Earthquake – Federal government did not cover full costs of rebuilding, California had to come up with money. Governor criticized Federal government for not doing enough given how much California pays to America.

2000 Power failure – massive electrical grid brownouts occur because the price of power was too high. Federal government provided no assistance, and refused to look into why the issue was occurring for 3 years. After which it turns out that Texas based energy companies illegally lied to California consumers which caused the power failure. California was not compensated for damages and the Federal government did not force Texas companies to pay California a fair share.

America will not help California in a financial or natural disaster

2001 Terrorist attack California was the most
vulnerable to terrorist attack in
America according to Homeland
Security after 911. Yet it took 5
years for California to get the
funding it deserved. California
ports had to raise taxes on
themselves to pay for terrorist
prevention.

2006 Earthquake - Its revealed FEMA has no plans for how to deal with a big California earthquake.

2008 Forest fires - are all over California and the Federal government denied help. In fact, the Federal government refuses to implement natural burning cycles which would prevent fires in the first place.

2010 Recession - California again denied help by the Federal government.

2016 Forest fires - Are out of control in California and Federal government denies help.

America will invade - this has to end up in a Civil War

Talking Points

- Why would they bother? We have no intention of using force or violating laws. The overwhelming perception from most of the "red states" is negative towards California.
- All proposed methods of gaining
 Independence are dependent upon
 International support and peaceful negotiations with America.
 Also imagine the world wide outrage. Nope.
 Not going to happen. This is a peaceful secession.

California does not have a military

Talking Points

- We have a small one and we could certainly build upon it.
- A military based on defense, not adventures in regime change and wars for profit.
- Won't need it.

It is not legal to become independent

Talking Points

- It is legal to become independent. The State of California has written an impact statement on the ballot initiative and outlines the legal precedent for being able to leave America.
- California was won in a war with a treaty that was promptly ignored by America, we never signed up for this in the first place.
- There is a legal process for departure, we need a super majority of states to agree to it.

FACTS

California Attorney General
Kathleen Kenealy said on Jan 10
2017 when talking about the
California independence initiative
that the only Supreme Court case
on independence did say that a
state could leave America
"through consent of the states".

"In 1869, following the Civil War, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in Texas v. White that the initial act admitting a state into the Union "was final." "There was no place for reconsideration, or revocation," the court said, "except through revolution, or through consent of the states."

California Attorney General Xavier Becerra said on Feb 10 2017 when interviewed by the New York Times that independence was difficult, but not illegal.

California constitution center at UC Berkeley on Nov 12 2016 said that the only Supreme Court case on independence did say that you could leave America "through consent of the states".

Talking Points

- That remains to be seen. There are a great many people in the red states who believe that we can't get along without them. They would love to see us separate so they can watch us fail. They really don't like us. We may very well get the votes when the time comes.
- We may not need the votes. No legal precedent has been set.
- Many states already resent California, falsely perceiving us as having outsized influence. We do not share a culture, history or belief system with the majority of America.
- "If Trump were ever elected, we'd have to build a wall around California to defend ourselves from the rest of this country," - Governor Brown 2016

FACTS

March 2017 - Rasmussen reports polled Americans and found that 31% said its okay for California to leave America.

October 2014 National voter poll conducted by FOX News shows that half of Americans want California "kicked out of the Union".

August 2013 American
National magazine "Business
Insider" conducts poll showing
that Americans hate California
the most and would like to see
it leave America.

February 2012 San Francisco Chronicle asks in headline "Why do so many people hate California?"

February 2012 LA Weekly announces that "California is America's most-hated state".

Federal funds will be cut

Talking Points

- We give a lot more to the feds than we get.
 60 to 70 billion dollars a year will be coming our way.
- We already have the American government stealing \$60-70B USD from California.
 What's to cut?
- Federal taxes currently paid to America will be paid to California, we will actually have more money available for our needs.
- "...It doesn't make sense to me for the Federal Government to ... insist that the only solution to our local problems is for them to take the money and then dispense it back to you in grants." – Governor Reagan 1967

Talking Points

- Many newspapers have confirmed that California is a donor state for the last couple decades – where they all wrong?
- "The federal government is part of our problem. We are currently owed billions of dollars by the federal government for various programs. We no longer can ignore what is owed to us." - Governor Schwarzenegger 2010
- "Until a sincere effort is made at the federal level to reach an equitable agreement on these funds, I find it difficult to see how meaningful progress can be made..."
 Governor Deukmejian 1985

Talking Points

- I would not know. I am not a liberal. I am fiscally conservative and socially liberal --- and I do not believe in nametags or labels.
- There are a range of political beliefs represented in the movement for California Independence. Many have wanted this for a long time. The recent election just highlighted the differences, and the complete lack of representation for California. Much like the spark that ignited the Boston Tea Party and declaration of Independence.
- Hurt democracy? It will be a democratic process. The people will be getting what they vote for. How does that hurt democracy? As for the, "Liberals crying," thing, that is known as an ad hominem argument. You're calling us names rather than discussing our assertions. The remark is irrelevant.

Nope. Our voice will still be loud and clear.

Talking Points

Talking Points

- Been doing that 50 years. How is that working out for us?
- The reason for California independence is that we have decided, based on long experience, that attempting to share our values with the red states is an exercise in futility.
- We would be more effective as an independent Nation in providing an example of our values, without the current hindrances and resentments from America.
- A conference, or "fixing" America will never address the underlying issue of lack of representation for our population.

This is about hurting America, making it weak

Talking Points

- A guilt trip? I can't believe it. Remaining with America will do us harm. It makes no sense to maintain this relationship. Sentimental sadness, yes. But guilt, no.
- This is a natural progression for an area with 40 million very diverse people, in an area that would cover New York to North Carolina. We are naturally a nation not a state. Undertaking our own federal responsibilities would be beneficial to both America and California.
- Nope. They abandoned us.

The Northern Counties will secede, this will split California up

Talking Points

- The northern rural counties are vastly important. Their main complaints are about not being respected and being overburdened with regulation. In an independent California they will have one less layer of regulation, greater voice, and a government that wants to emphasize local control while protecting our natural resources.
- Doubtful. They need us, we need them.

Conservatives will never support

Talking Points

- Yes they do. This is a lie.
- It is too early to tell. We need to work harder to address the concrete issues that the conservatives have, particularly in the central valley.
- An emphasis on local control, one less layer of regulation, and a more direct, non-corporate election system will appeal to the more libertarian type of conservatives that are more the California norm than the extreme religious right.

The Republican party is orchestrating this

Talking Points

- Another ad hominem. The Republicans also agree that 2+2=4. They also agree that the sky is blue. Must those things therefore be wrong? I have decided that a move towards California independence would be good for me. If Republicans want to join me, so much the better.
- If some initial leaders were Republican, it just means the idea appeals to a large cross-section of Californians.
- We have broad support from multiple political parties and a huge amount of Independents. Nobody cares who you voted for or if you have not voted in the past as long as you support California Independence.

California politicians do not support the movement

Talking Points

- California politicians are already showing a huge amount of Independence towards the United States. Some will eventually see the need for autonomy. Others won't. That's fine, we don't want to replicate America's two party system anyway.
- "Today, we woke up feeling like strangers in a foreign land, because yesterday Americans expressed their views on a pluralistic and democratic society that are clearly inconsistent with the values of the people of California." – Senator Kevin De Leon

This is a fringe movement

Talking Points

- Movements initially considered fringe include:
 Votes for women, abolition, marriage equality, and on and on and on.
- California possibly leaving America has made every newspaper and TV news in California and it is still fringe?

Californians will never get a majority of California to agree to independence

Talking Points

- At least 45% are willing to look at it. The other 20% just want to see what everyone else thinks first.
- Polls already show a third of Californians agreeing.
 Like any new idea, support grows over time, look at marijuana or marriage equality. Fortunately, due to social media and the internet, acceptance can be gained much more quickly than in the past.
- We are growing by leaps and bounds as of now.
 Again, too early to tell.

Talking Points

- I'm a real Californian. Going back many, many generations. California is a nation of immigrants, from inside and outside the U.S. we welcome everyone. They are just as "real" as I am.
- LOL. Wake up and read the real news.

Talking Points

- This is a lie.
- You have evidence of this?
- No, that is untrue. The fact the corporate media is trying to spin it that way just shows they are threatened by the rapid growth of this movement.

Talking Points

Talking Points

- Nope. Not if we do not pay into the DC system the \$60-70B. In fact, a flat tax for everyone would work best.

- Less money going to support foreign military involvement. The taxes collected will provide greater services for the community. You will be able to see where your money goes.

How would you explain California independence
